

From your Pastor's Desk Fr. Mike Eckley



A Joyful and Blessed Easter to All

The above greeting is not a mistake. It was on last week's bulletin and also on for this week. The Church celebrates Easter for 50 days but it celebrates the Octave, the first eight days, as if it is Easter Day. So today is the eighth and last day of the Octave.

On this Easter Day we hear of how the Early Church lived. This is an ideal image. It didn't mean that there were not divisions among them. There were just like communities, families, and parishes today; they had to find ways to work through their differences and problems. What drew them together though is what draws us together today. It was the Eucharist. Twice in today's First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles it talks about how the Early Believers dedicated themselves to the 'Breaking of Bread'. Our reading begins, "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers." and later we read, "Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to **breaking** bread in their homes." This is more than just sharing food with each other. Last Thursday on Holy Thursday we remembered how Jesus took bread and broke it. Also, how He also took the cup and passed it to his disciples. He told them to continue to do this in memory of Him. The Church continued to do this in memory of Him and we hear how central this was to the life of the Early Believers.

It is the Eucharist that unites us and helps us to overcome our differences. It is important that we continue to make this an important part of what we do as individuals and community. We see the witness in today's First Reading of just how important it was to the First Generation Believers.

In the Gospel we hear the very familiar story of Jesus' first appearance to His disciples on the night of the Resurrection. How Thomas was not there and how he refused to believe until he could see and touch Jesus himself. The next week we hear how Thomas was there and Jesus appeared again to the disciples. Jesus speaks directly to Thomas and tells Thomas to do what he desired, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." We are never told whether Thomas actually does this but he does make the profession, "My Lord and My God!"

As we come together today we see, touch and taste the Lord in the Eucharist. We don't see the Lord as Thomas and the other apostles did but the Lord is no less present to us as He was to them. Let us pray that our reception of the Eucharist today strengthen our faith and our profession as it did Thomas's faith and his profession of the Lord. Let us also pray that as we celebrate the Eucharist which unites us that it will heal any divisions that we have in our families, communities and our parish.

Update on Bottle Club Opening

Many of us signed a petition a few weekends ago expressing our strong opposition to a Member Club opening at 73rd and Farnam.

16 pages of our signatures were delivered to Mayor Stothert and to Councilmen Jerram and Festersen. We understand from city officials that under current law, their hands were tied, and that they could not prevent the club from opening.

Senator Tyson Larson, Chairman of the General Affairs Committee of the Nebraska Unicameral has introduced LB 632. The bill has a provision that would require state licensing of private bottle clubs. A copy of our signed petition has been sent to Senator Larson.

We encourage parishioners who oppose this kind of club to contact Senator Larson, Phone: (402) 471-2801, Email: tlarson@leg.ne.gov. Please thank him for introducing LB 632 and urge him to advance a version of the bill that will address our concerns and prohibit nude dancing at member clubs.


