

From your Pastor's Desk Fr. Mike Eckley



If you look below at "Please Pray" you will see I'm going out of town later this week. Whenever I travel I seem to over pack. I always want to be prepared for whatever I may encounter. Over the years I've tried to pare down the amount of things I bring so as to make traveling easier. As much as I 'over pack' I always seem to forget something important such as a toothbrush, razor, or other essential. The Gospel this weekend asks are you ready to go if the Lord calls you today?

Please Pray: This week on Wednesday night, 8 Youth from our parish and our Youth Minister, Janet Drvol, will be leaving on buses for Indianapolis, IN to join hundreds of other youth from the Archdiocese of Omaha and thousands of youth from the United States for the National Catholic Youth Conference. I will be flying out Thursday to meet them. Please pray for safe travel for all and also that the Conference will be a great opportunity for those participating to Encounter Our Lord in a new and dynamic way and deepen their faith.

Calendar Club: As I've often mentioned, my mom hosts an Annual Halloween Party. Since being in Omaha and at St. Pius X, I've always made it over for at least part of the evening. When I lived out of town it was hard to come in since Halloween is connected to All Saints and the Holy Day of Obligation. Since being at St. Pius, when I go to the party I also bring Calendar Club tickets with me. I do the same when I have the Annual Christmas Party with the friends I grew up with and their wives. So far we have sold 281 Calendar Club Tickets. We have 1 month before sales cut off. Please help us make this fundraiser a success. I find them easy sales to friends and family. It would be great to sell 1000 tickets. Even if we don't get there, we can go over our record which is just over 800 tickets. Tickets are available for purchase and sale in the Narthex and in the parish office.

One Spirit, One Vision, One Community Campaign News: The pledge total for our One Spirit, One Vision, One Community capital campaign continues to grow as more and more parishioners make their pledge decisions. The current total is almost \$2.3 million with almost \$650,000 designated for goals of St. Pius X Parish.

Our goals at St. Pius X Parish are straightforward. We hope to pay off the \$550,000 that we owe on the beautiful renovations of our church. We need about \$480,000 to do some repairs and updates to our parish center and offices including the shared cost with the school of repaving our parking lots. We also need to make technology updates in the parish offices.

Taking care of these capital expenses will put the parish in a great position financially going forward. You can help us make it a reality by supporting our capital campaign. If you haven't made a pledge yet, please turn in your pledge card right away. If you don't have a pledge card, stop by the school office and pick one up or call the school office at (402) 551-6667. Campaign volunteers will also be in the back of church after Mass the next two weekends to answer questions about the campaign and help with pledge cards.

Archbishop's Annual Appeal: I ask that you prayerfully consider a gift to this year's annual appeal. I've made my gift and invite you to do the same. The Archdiocesan goal this year is \$3,600,000 and our parish goal this year is **\$35,724.46.** To date we have donations and pledges of **\$25,335.04** or 71%. Thank you to all who have already donated!




