From your Pastor's Desk

This past Wednesday we received the Ashes on our foreheads. As they were applied one of two formulas was used: *"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."* or *"Repent, and believe in the gospel."* Over the years I've alternated between the two. This year I used the formula, *"Repent, and believe in the gospel."* These are the same words that we hear from Jesus at the end of today's Gospel. Jesus begins his public ministry by going to Galilee after His 40 Days in the desert and announcing, ***"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."*** During this Lenten Season we are invited to repent, to turn away from sin in our lives and turn to the full life the Lord offers us.

At our Baptism we were cleansed from Original Sin and any practical sin that was part of our life. Through Water and the Holy Spirit we became adopted Children of God. As Children, as members of His Household we are heirs to His Kingdom. This Kingdom Jesus says is at hand. We are to get ready. Although we have been purified and cleansed in Baptism, we also know that we are not always faithful to the Covenant.

God is always faithful to the Covenants that he makes with us. In the First Reading from the Book of Genesis we hear the story of Noah and his family. God makes a promise to those who survived the great flood along with the animals on the Ark that he will never again destroy all living creatures by water. He gives to Noah and to us a sign, the bow in the sky. This bow is a reminder to us that God is faithful. He always keeps His promises.

We are not always faithful. Israel's history, the history of humankind and even our own personal history is a story of faithfulness and failure. We have not always held up our part of the Covenant. We have fallen short often. As we enter into Lent we are invited to repent and live a different way.

When we do repent and ask for the Lord's forgiveness, He again is faithful. As St. Peter reminds us in today's Second Reading, ***"Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God."*** By the Lord's suffering our debt for sin has been paid. His forgiveness is offered to us. As we repent and turn away from sin we are to be lead back to God who gives us the fullness of life. During this Lenten Season I invite you to take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It will enable us to repent and believe!

Parish Mission: You will see elsewhere in this bulletin information about our Parish Mission beginning next Sunday evening. I want to extend a personal invitation. Our Mission speaker this year, Fr. Ralph O'Donnell is someone I've known most of my life. Fr. Ralph and I grew up in the same neighborhood. Fr. Ralph is an excellent speaker and story teller. I'm personally looking forward to hearing his message and I know from others in the past who have heard him speak, they rave about his presentations. Fr. Ralph's message will be appropriate for people of all ages. Please plan on coming Sunday and Monday Night to hear Fr. Ralph and then come on Tuesday night for a night of Parish Fellowship and Sharing done in the context of a Pot-Luck Dinner.

Our Mission IS our Mission

Our Lenten mission theme (Come and See. Go and Share.) fits perfectly with the Church's process of evangelization and conversion known as RCIA, or the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The RCIA process begins with people getting to know what Catholicism is like. They grow in faith and understanding of Catholicism, and deepen their relationship with the community, eventually coming into full communion with the Church by receiving the sacraments.

RCIA gets to the heart of who we are and what we do at St. Pius X.

During this year of invitation, we are being very deliberate in reaching out to those who are not Catholic or who are not practicing Catholics, and inviting them to find out what it means to live as disciples of Christ. We cannot keep the good news of salvation to ourselves; Jesus sends us to share it!



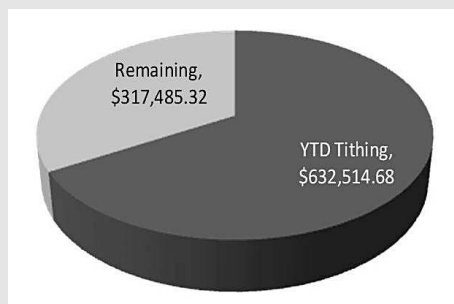
A vibrant RCIA program testifies to

the kind of witness and invitation that we extend. Today, as a parish we will "send" the RCIA catechumens (unbaptized inquirers) and candidates (those baptized in another Christian denomination) to the Cathedral to meet Archbishop Lucas. They go as a part of our small community, which is part of a larger community in Nebraska, which is part of the one, Catholic Church. They will state their desire to **receive communion** and to **be received into full communion** with the Church. Please continue to pray for them during Lent.

Liturgy

We are reminded, in several ways in today's readings, that Forty Days marks our season of Lent. The rainbow appeared to Noah at the end of forty days of rain – a sign of God's promise, and a symbol of baptism. In the gospel, Jesus spends forty days in the desert, at the end of which he begins his public ministry and proclamation of the good news of salvation. It is in the letter of St Peter, however, where we find an interpretation that centers all three readings for us: "put to death in the flesh, [Christ] was brought to life in the

Spirit."

Dying and Rising marks this Lenten season. For forty days, we die to sin so that we might rise to new life at Easter, renewing our own baptism. This Dying is the beginning of new life in the Spirit.

At St. Pius X parish, this season of Lent is also marked visibly with seeds, as they die in order to grow. A seed or grain, whether wheat or peas or a flower, is a powerful image of Dying and Rising. The seed must give up its life as a seed in order to take root and sprout. The single seed is no longer,

but it has become food or beauty for others to enjoy!

So, pick up some seeds and a prayer card or two. Share the progress of your plant as you yourself or experiencing your own dying and rising. Throughout this Lenten season, as you participate in this process, connect spiritually with Noah, with Jesus, with St Peter: observe, reflect, and pray as your seeds produce sprouts and stalks, buds and fruit. Share your seeds and your reflections with others!
