From the Finance Committee June 30th is the end of the parish's fiscal year and it is our goal to finish in the black when all of the income and expenses items are finally tabulated. Since the finance committee made its appeal last November to parishioners to increase their giving by 50%, the response has been commendable: the payments to the school are current and a fund for renovation of the parish center has been established. The 2024/2025 parish budget has been approved by the finance committee and will be submitted to the Archdiocese this month. This budget was carefully scrutinized by the finance committee and is one that enables the parish to maintain its strong commitment to the school and the various parish ministries.

A huge thank you to all who supported our Parish Festival with their time, talents and treasure. Special thanks to the Festival leadership team – who brought new energy and creativity to the planning of this year's Festival.

Finally we want to acknowledge the volunteers who assisted in the carpeting and painting of the rectory living quarters for our pastor and to those who contributed funds to allow us to complete this project before Fr. Mark's arrival. This effort is a reflection of our parish tradition of "sacrifice, hard work and simplicity."

School Renovation Update

The school cafeteria feature:

- New tile flooring (no more brown tiles!)
- Updated columns
- Removal of the wood paneling on the west walls and adding crisp tile that is easy to clean.
- A cloud ceiling to enhance the atmosphere and improve acoustics.
- Lockers and a variety of random filing cabinets will go and new built in storage for extended care will be added to consolidate, declutter, and keep them organized.
- Functional desk for efficient check-in and check-out of students in extended care.
- Water bottle filling stations on either side of the cafeteria - environmentally friendly and satisfy the state requirement of water available for students (i.e. we can get rid of the igloos!)

- New A/V equipment including a projection screen for presentations/events, smart TVs the connect with the screen, speakers in the ceiling for high quality presentations and the availability of music for our students.

We are also making some improvements to the school kitchen that will make a positive impact:

- Decluttering! After being in the school for almost 70 years, there was a lot we did not use and will never use again. Old appliances and other items that have been stored in this space for years are being removed/donated.
- The kitchen floor is not in good shape. It will be refinished with a new epoxy floor that will create a better look and is expected to last.
- Some reorganization of where things are located in the kitchen will be done to improve efficiency and clean up the space.

The kitchen piece was limited in scope because additional changes would have necessitated bringing all the electrical, plumbing etc. completely up to code - a very costly endeavor particularly when those requirements are geared toward kitchens that cook food rather than our arrangement where food is brought into the kitchen to be served.

Eucharistic Pilgrimage a Cross Country Journey May 17th to July 17th Jesus is on the move! Four small groups of young adults are in the midst of an epic journey which began at north, south, east and west edges of United States. They are journeying with Jesus in the Eucharist across our whole country, blessing over 6000, miles of our nation in the shape of a cross.
